 ARE YOU INVOLVED IN ANY ASPECT OF HIP FRACTURE REHABILITATION?

Whether you are based in the acute sector, intermediate care or in the community, if you currently offer rehabilitation for patients who have had a hip fracture, this national audit is for you....

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- Are you involved in delivering any aspect of hip fracture rehabilitation?
- Would you like to be part of a national clinical audit?
- Are you interested in improving the experience of older people who have experienced a hip fracture?

This year, the Royal College of Physicians Falls and Fragility Fractures audit programme (funded by the CSP) is running a hip fracture rehabilitation programme with the aim of understanding the whole patient pathway and the contribution of physiotherapy to outcome. This will cover the acute, post-acute and community journey from first day mobilisation to 120 days follow up.

The audit data will be analysed with the National Hip Fracture Database and provide a rich source of information which will:

- ✓ Gain a better understanding of the whole patient pathway (local and national)
- ✓ Enable a better understanding of the relationship between rehabilitation and outcomes
- ✓ Identify improvements to service delivery models
- ✓ Increase awareness amongst commissioners of rehabilitation across the pathway

The success of this audit in delivering improvement in patients' experience and outcomes is dependent upon us, as AGILE members, to engage with this national audit.

Tell us what you need to know about Parkinson's - Ana Aragon, OT and AHP Learning Pathway Adviser, Parkinson's UK

Contribute your views and experiences via an online Survey of Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists and Speech & Language Therapists. The UK Parkinson's Excellence Network is an initiative aimed at improving healthcare services and is now developing a suite of learning pathways for physiotherapists, occupational therapists and for speech and language therapists - supported by Parkinson's UK. To gather details for this project we are undertaking a survey, to inform learning pathways aligned to both professional competencies and the KSF framework. This will help us develop a one stop point of information about educational needs and resources for the 3 Therapy professions, to support working with people living with Parkinson's. The pathways will evolve further as additional resources are created to fill gaps identified in existing resources.

We are keen to hear from as many physiotherapists as possible, whether you see people with Parkinson's everyday or a couple of times a year.
